CITIZENS INPUT

- TERRY TITUS** Terry asked about Long Run Road. He said it is horrible and he spends money on car repairs. He said the water washes his driveway out. The Supervisors said it was next after completion of Egypt Road and Hoopup Road. Ron Krise asked for patience.
- BRUCE MAINES** Bruce said they have been told numerous times Long Run Road was going to be paved but it hasn't as of yet. Ron Krise told him as well to be patient. He said he is tired of being lied to and doesn't believe what they are saying.
- BURT MAINES** Burt talked about a conversation he had with Ron Krise on Long Run Road. He asked Ron if he did indeed tell him that when Egypt Road and Hoopup Road were completed if Long Run Road would be next. Ron said he did tell him that and Egypt Road and Hoopup Road are not completed as yet. He said it would most likely not be until next year. Burt also asked why the meeting time was changed to 4:01. He was told there are very few people that come to the meetings and it was discussed with other municipalities that were also looking at changing meeting times for the same reason and discussion on PSATS board. Burt also asked about a light pole that had been recently replaced and the street light was not put back on the pole. The supervisors said they would look into it.

- BIGLER CEMETERY** Sally Morgan asked for volunteers from Bradford Township to help with the Bigler Cemetery and to see if someone would be interested in taking over. Most of the volunteers have resigned.
- BIGLER MARKER** A resident of the township has requested of the supervisors to contact PennDOT in regards to moving the Bigler Keystone Marker on Pinetop Road to a safer location from damage since it was broken and has been repaired. The supervisors said they would send a letter to PennDOT.
- MEDICAL INSURANCE** Medical insurance renewal has brought a savings of \$6,007.80 for the year by switching from UPMC to Highmark.
